For making a Railway from Leeds by Dewsbury to Huddersfield, all in the West Riding of the County of York, and for improving the Communication by Railway between the Towns of Leeds and Huddersfield and the Town of Man-[Royal Assent, 30th June, 1845.] chester.

THEREAS the making of a Railway from Leeds Preamble. by Dewsbury to Huddersfield, in the West Riding of the County of York, would be of great public advantage, and would improve the communication by Railway between the towns of Leeds and Huddersfield, and the town of Manchester:

And whereas the persons hereinafter named are willing at their own expense to carry such Undertaking into execution, but the same cannot be effected without the authority of Parliament:

May it therefore please Your MAJESTY,

That it may be enacted; And be it Enacted, by the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the several Acts following, that 1. is to say, the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, Incorporation of General Acts of the Pailways and the Pailways the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Railways ral Acts. Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, shall be incorporated with

and form part of this Act, and shall, with the same, be construed as one Act.

Short title.

And be it enacted, That in citing this Act in other Acts of Parliament and in legal instruments, it shall be sufficient to use the expression, "The Leeds, Dewsbury, and Manchester Railway Act, 1845."

And be it enacted, That John Allison, Joseph Armitage, incorporated. parish of Kirkheaton, all in the West Riding of the county of York, together with the several Branch Railways hereinafter mentioned, and with proper works and conveniences belonging thereto respectively, according to the provisions of the said Acts, and of this Act, and for other the purposes herein and in the said Acts contained; and, for the purposes aforesaid, such Company shall be incorporated by the name of "The Leeds, Dewsbury, and Manchester Railway Company," and by that name shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession, and shall have power to purchase and hold lands for the purposes of the Undertaking, within the restrictions herein and in the said Acts contained.

And whereas the estimated expense of making the said Capital. Railway is six hundred and forty thousand pounds, be it enacted, That the capital of the Company shall be six hundred and fifty thousand pounds: Provided nevertheless, that if, under the provisions hereinafter contained, the Company shall not execute so much of the Railway hereby authorized, as lies between the Town of Huddersfield and the Junction thereof with the Manchester and Leeds Railway, then the capital of the Company shall be only five hundred thousand

And be it enacted, That the number of shares into which Number and the capital shall be divided shall be thirteen thousand if the Shares. Company shall raise the whole sum of six hundred and fifty thousand pounds, and ten thousand if the Company shall only raise the sum of five hundred thousand pounds, and the amount of each share shall be fifty pounds.

And be it enacted, That five pounds per share shall be Calls. the greatest amount of any one call which the Company may make on the shareholders, and twenty pounds of the amount of a share shall be the utmost aggregate amount of calls that may be made in any one year upon any share, and three months at the least shall be the interval between successive calls.

And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Com- Power to pany to borrow on mortgage or bond any sums not exceeding borrow Money. in the whole the sum of one hundred and sixty-six thousand pounds, but no part of such sum shall be borrowed until the whole of the said capital or sum of five hundred thousand 13 pounds

pounds shall have been subscribed for, and three hundred and twenty-five thousand pounds shall have been actually paid up.

- Number and Qualification of Directors.
  - And be it enacted, That the number of Directors shall be nine, and the qualification of a Director shall be the possession in his own right of twenty shares in the Undertaking.
- 9. Power to vary the Number of Directors.
- And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Company to increase or reduce the number of Directors, provided that the increased number do not exceed twelve and that the reduced number be not less than five.
- 10. First Directors.
- And be it enacted, That Christopher Beckett, William Williams Brown, Thomas Benyon, Joseph Brook, Thomas Cook, John Gott, James Garth Marshall, David William Nell and Thomas Starkey, shall be the first Directors of the Company.
- 11. Quorum.
- And be it enacted, That the quorum of a meeting of Directors shall be three.
- 12. Committee
- And be it enacted, That the number of Directors, of of Directors which committees appointed by the Directors shall consist, shall be not less than three nor more than five, and the quorum of such committee shall be two.
- 13. Newspaper for insertion of Advertisements.
- And be it enacted, That the newspaper in which advertisements relating to the affairs of the Company are to be inserted, shall be some newspaper published in the West Riding of the county of York.
- 14. Power to make Railway according to De-Plans. osited

And whereas plans and sections of the Railway, showing the line and levels thereof, and also books of reference, containing the names of the owners, lessees and occupiers, or reputed owners, lessees and occupiers, of the lands through which the same is intended to pass, have been deposited with the clerk of the peace of the West Riding of the county of York; be it therefore enacted, That, subject to the provisions in this and the said Acts contained, it shall be lawful for the said Company to make and maintain the said Railway and Works in the line and upon the lands delineated on the said plans, and described in the said books of reference, and to enter upon, take and use such of the said lands as shall be necessary for such purpose.

And be it enacted, That the said Railway shall com-Line of Railmence in the township of Holbeck, in the parish of Leeds, way. there forming a junction with the Leeds and Bradford Railway, and shall pass through or into the several places following, or some of them; that is to say, Leeds, Holbeck, Wortley, Beeston, Churwell, West Ardsley otherwise Woodchurch, Morley, Batley, Soothill, Batley Car, Dewsbury, Mirfield, Kirkheaton and Huddersfield, all in the West Riding of the county of York; and shall (subject to the provisions hereinafter mentioned respecting the execution of the works of such Railway between the town of Huddersfield and the junction of the said Railway with the Line of the Manchester and Leeds Railway) terminate at or near the town of Huddersfield, in the township and parish of Huddersfield, and also by a junction with the Manchester and Leeds Railway, in the township and parish of Kirkheaton aforesaid: And one of such Branch Railways shall be made within the township and parish of Kirkheaton aforesaid, and shall form a junction with the said Manchester and Leeds Railway: And another of such Branch Railways shall be made within the township and parish of Mirfield aforesaid, and shall also form a junction with the Manchester and Leeds Railway: And another of such Branch Railways shall commence in the township and parish of Batley, and shall pass through or into the several townships of Batley, Birstal and Gomersal, or some of them, all in the said West Riding, and shall terminate at or near the town of Birstal, in the township of Gomersal and parish of Birstal aforesaid: And another of such Branch Railways shall commence in the township of Wortley, in the parish of Leeds aforesaid, and shall pass through or into the several townships of Wortley, Holbeck and Leeds, and shall terminate in the township and parish of Leeds aforesaid.

And be it enacted, That the quantity of land to be taken Lands for by the Company for extraordinary purposes shall not exceed Stations, &c. fifty acres.

Provided always, and be it enacted, That the powers of Restriction the Company for the compulsory purchase of any of the sory Powers lands belonging to John Atkinson Christopher Kemplay and as to certain James Kemplay, as trustees of Richard Kemplay, deceased, and to Annabella Kemplay, Christopher Kemplay, James Kemplay

Kemplay and Henry Snowdon, and situate at the Monkpitts, in the township of Leeds, shall not be exercised after the expiration of twelve calendar months from the passing of this Act.

Not to intertain Property.

Provided always, and be it enacted, That this Act shall fere with cer- not, nor shall anything herein contained, enable the said Leeds, Dewsbury and Manchester Railway Company to enter upon nor to take for the purposes of the said Railway, nor for any purposes whatsoever, any part of the house, warehouses, buildings, lands or hereditaments whereof, in the schedule to this Act, Alexander Henry, William J Scholefield, George Wilders, William Firth, William R Johnson and Thomas Barton, or some or one of them, are described as the owners or reputed owners, nor to stop up nor divert any part of the cross street leading from Aire Street to Wellington Street, nor any part of Aire Street lying to the eastward of the centre of the said cross street, without the previous consent in writing of the owner or owners for the time being of the said house, warehouses, buildings, lands and hereditaments.

19. Period for Completion of Works.

And be it enacted, That the Railway shall be completed within seven years from the passing of this Act, and on the expiration of such period the powers by this Act or the said Acts granted to the Company for executing the Railway, or otherwise in relation thereto, shall cease to be exercised, except as to so much of the Railway as shall then be completed.

20. Power to cross certain Roads on a level.

And whereas the Line of the said Railway, or of the Branches thereof, or some of them, is proposed to be carried across the several highways following; that is to say, a public highway called Holbeck Lane, near Copley Hill, in the township of Wortley, a public highway in the township and parish of Mirfield, numbered 33 on the said Plans deposited with the Clerk of the Peace, and a public highway in the township and parish of Batley, numbered 87 on the same Plans, and it is expedient that the said Railway should cross the said highways on a level: Be it therefore enacted, That the said Company may make the said Railway across the said highways on a level.

And whereas the said Railway is intended to be carried For protecover the Canal Navigation from Leeds to Liverpool, at or tion of Leeds near a certain place called Monkpitts Bridge, in the township pool Canal. of Holbeck, in the West Riding of the county of York, and it is expedient to provide against obstructions being occasioned thereby to the free navigation of the said canal, be it therefore enacted, That, in carrying the said Railway over the said canal, the said Company of Proprietors hereby incorporated shall, and they are hereby required, at their own expense, to make a good and substantial bridge of brick, stone or iron, over the said canal and the towing path thereof, with proper approaches thereto, and with perpendicular foundation walls to such bridge, the underside of the opening at the keystone of the arch of such bridge not being less than eleven feet in height above the top water level of the said canal upon which bridge the said Railway shall be made, and the opening or span of the arch of the said bridge shall not be less than forty feet wide, so as to extend over and include the entire width of the said canal and of the towing path, without the consent of the engineer of the said Company of Proprietors of the said Canal Navigation; and the space between the piers of the arch of such bridge (except so much thereof respectively as shall be occupied by the towing path of such canal) shall, after the said bridge shall have been completed, from time to time, and at all times thereafter, except during the necessary repairs of the said bridge, or the erection of any future bridge in lieu thereof, be left and preserved an open uninterrupted navigable waterway.

Provided always and be it enacted, That the said Com- Company pany hereby incorporated shall and are hereby required during not to obthe progress of constructing the said bridge, or of the necessary Navigation repairs thereof, or of the erection of any future bridge in lieu of Leeds and thereof, from time to time and at all times to leave an open Liverpool Canal in conuninterrupted navigable waterway in the said canal of not structing or less than thirty-four feet in width during the time of con-repairing their Bridges. structing and putting in the foundation of the said bridge, up to two feet above the water level of the said canal, which time shall not exceed six weeks, nor less than forty feet during the remainder of the period of constructing the said bridge; and in case by reason or in execution of any of the works by this act authorized, or by reason of the bad state of repair of the said bridge, the said canal shall be so obstructed as that boats, barges and other vessels navigating or using the same

shall not be able to pass along the same, or in case the navigable waterway hereinbefore required to be preserved during the progress of the works shall at any time be contracted to a less width than hereinbefore prescribed, then the said Company of Proprietors hereby incorporated shall pay to the said Company of Proprietors of the said Canal Navigation, as or by way of ascertained damages, the sum of fifty pounds for every day not exceeding fourteen days, and so in proportion for any less time than one day, during which such obstruction or contraction shall continue on the said canal; and in default of payment of the said sum, on demand made of the treasurer or principal clerk of the said Company hereby incorporated, any two or more of her Majesty's justices of the peace for the West Riding of the said county of York are hereby empowered, on application to them made by the said Company of Proprietors of the said Canal Navigation, or by any person or persons by them authorized by warrant under their hands and seals, to cause the amount of such sum or sums of money to be levied by distress and sale of any goods and chattels vested in the said Company of Proprietors hereby incorporated by virtue of this Act, and to be paid to the said Company of Proprietors of the said Canal Navigation, or to their treasurer or clerk for the time being, rendering the overplus, if any, upon demand, after deducting the reasonable charges of making such distress and sale, and the costs and expenses of hearing and determining the matter in dispute, to the treasurer of the said Company of Proprietors hereby incorporated for the use of such Company, otherwise the said Company of Proprietors of the said Canal Navigation may sue for and recover the same, together with costs of suit, against the said Company of Proprietors hereby incorporated, by action of debt or on the case, in any of her Majesty's Courts of Record in Westminster.

23. Company to maintain Bridge.

Provided always and be it enacted, That unless and until the said Railway, where it crosses the said canal, shall at any time be abandoned by the said Company, the said Company shall and they are hereby required at their own expense to maintain the said bridge and arch in perfect repair, and if that part of the said Railway shall at any time be abandoned by the said Company, the said Company shall at their own expense remove the said bridge if they shall be required so to do by the Company of Proprietors of the Canal Navigation from Leeds to Liverpool.

And be it enacted, That nothing in this Act contained Not to intershall take away, diminish, alter, lessen, prejudice, or affect fere with Calder and any of the rights, privileges, powers or authorities of the Hebble Na-Company of Proprietors of the Calder and Hebble Navigavigation, nor

And be it enacted, That in carrying the said Railway Prescribing over the canal, banks and towing path of the said Com- manner of pany of Proprietors of the Calder and Hebble Navigation, Bridges over in the township of Mirfield, in the said West Riding, the Cuts in the Township of said Railway Company shall, and they are hereby required, Mirfield. at their own costs and expenses, to make, and at all times for ever thereafter maintain and keep in perfect repair, a good and substantial bridge over the said Navigation, and the towing path thereof; and the soffit of the arch of such bridge shall be constructed at the greatest height, and the arch of the greatest span not being less than fifty feet, measured at right angles with the canal, which the level of the said Railway will admit of; and the said bridge shall be constructed in such manner as shall be agreed by the engineer of the said Railway Company, and the engineer of the said Calder and Hebble Navigation Company, and in case they should differ respecting the same, in such manner as an umpire (being a civil engineer) to be appointed by them shall appoint and direct: Provided always, that the soffit of the arch of such bridge over the said canal in the township of Mirfield aforesaid shall not be less than fourteen feet above the ordinary top water level of such canal.

And be it enacted, That in carrying the said Railway Prescribing over the navigable part of the River Calder, in the respective manner of townships of Mirfield and Kirkheaton, in the said West Riding, Bridges over and over the towing path adjoining to such river, the said Rail-the River way Company shall, and they are hereby required, at their part of the Calder and own cost and expense, to make, and at all times for ever Hebble Na-

thereafter vigation.

thereafter maintain and keep in perfect repair a good and substantial bridge over the said Navigation, and the towing path thereof; and such bridge shall be constructed in such manner as shall be agreed by the engineer of the said Railway Company, and the engineer of the said Calder and Hebble Navigation; and in case they should differ respecting the same, in such manner as an umpire (being a civil engineer) to be appointed by them shall order and direct: Provided always, that in no case shall the soffit of the arch of such bridge be less than eighteen feet above the water level of the crown of the first dam immediately below the said bridge, nor the arch of such bridge over the said Navigation be of less span than will be sufficient to leave under it a navigable waterway in the most navigable part of the said river, and a continuous and uninterrupted towing path adjoining thereto, and unseparated therefrom, of fifty feet together, measured at right angles with the said river; and if by the construction of such bridge the present towing path shall be separated by any pier or otherwise from the most navigable part of such river, then and in such case the said Railway Company shall, and they are hereby required, at their own costs and expenses, to provide and make a good and sufficient towing path under the direction of such engineers or umpire as aforesaid, and fence in the same and make the necessary communication and approaches thereto, so as to secure along the said Navigation an uninterrupted and continuous towing path adjoining to the most navigable part of the said river in the place of the one so separated as aforesaid.

No obstruction to be made to the Calder and Hebble Navigation, &c.

And be it enacted, That, during the erection of the said several bridges, or during the execution of any work authorized or required to be made by the said Railway Company for the said Calder and Hebble Navigation Company, or which may interfere with the said Navigation, and at all future times during any repairs thereof, no obstruction shall be occasioned to the said Navigation, or to the boats or barges passing along the same, or to the towing horses drawing such boats or barges; but that at all times during such erection or repairs a navigable waterway of not less than thirty feet, a towing path adjoining to and unseparated therefrom of not less than six feet, and a clear height sufficient for boats to pass along, shall be left in the main line of the said Navigation and towing path, and that the said bridges and other works

and repairs shall be constructed and made to the satisfaction of such engineers or umpire as aforesaid.

And be it enacted, That if by reason and in execu-Penalty for tion of any of the works by this Act authorized or required obstruction of the Calder to be made, or by reason of the bad state of repair of any and Hebble such works or of any of the said bridges, or if by any act Navigation. or omission of the said Railway Company, or any of their agents, servants or workmen, the said Calder and Hebble Navigation, or the towing paths thereof, shall be so obstructed as that boats, barges, or other vessels navigating or using the same cannot pass, or shall be impeded in the passage along the same, or in case the space under the said bridges shall be at any time contracted, so as to be less in width or height than is hereinbefore prescribed, then and in any of the said cases the said Railway Company shall pay to the said Company of Proprietors of the Calder and Hebble Navigation, as or by way of ascertained damages, the sum of fifty pounds for every day not exceeding fourteen days, and so in proportion for any less time than one day during which the said obstruction shall continue on the said navigation; and in default of payment of such respective sum, or such proportion thereof as shall become due, on demand made of the treasurer of the said Railway Company, the said Company of Proprietors of the Calder and Hebble Navigation may sue for and recover the same, together with full costs of suit, against the said Railway Company, by action of debt or on the case, in any of her Majesty's courts of record at Westminster; and in case the said bridges over the said Calder and Hebble Navigation, or any part thereof, or over the said canal, or the approaches, slides, slopes, or banks of the said Railway next to the said canal or river navigation, or any such bridges, approaches, slides, slopes or banks, or any part thereof respectively, shall not be kept in good and substantial repair, and if the said Railway Company shall not, within three days after notice in writing of such want of repairs given to their clerk by the clerk or principal engineer of the said Company of Proprietors of the Calder and Hebble Navigation, proceed to make and complete with all reasonable despatch the repairs so required, or in case of any pressing emergency, then it shall be lawful for the said Company of Proprietors of the said Calder and Hebble Navigation to do the needful repairs, and to recover the amount of the expenses from the said Railway Company, by action of debt or on the case, with full 13

costs of suit, in any of her Majesty's courts of record at Westminster: Provided also, that nothing herein contained shall extend to prevent the said Company of Proprietors of the said Calder and Hebble Navigation from recovering against the said Railway Company any special damage that may be sustained by them on account of such penalty or penalties, and they are hereby authorized to sue for and recover such special damages accordingly; but in every case where the penalty or penalties hereinbefore imposed shall have been paid by the said Railway Company, and any action for special damages shall be brought as above mentioned, then the penalty or penalties so paid shall be deemed and considered as payments on account of such special damages, and credit shall be given by the court before whom such action shall be tried for any sum or sums of money so paid by the said Railway Company, and the same shall be deducted from the amount of damages to be recovered by the said Company of Proprietors of the Calder and Hebble Navigation; and in case the amount of damages recovered shall not exceed the sum or sums so paid, then and in such case judgment shall be given for the said Railway Company; and no action shall be maintained by the said Company of Proprietors of the Calder and Hebble Navigation against the said Railway Company for the recovery of any penalty or penalties, after judgment shall have been obtained by them for any special damage in respect of the said act or acts for which such penalty or penalties would have been recoverable.

Power to the Calder and Hebble Navigation Company to accept other Bridges than those above directed.

And be it enacted That, it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Company of Proprietors of the Calder and Hebble Navigation, by writing, under their common seal, to accept any bridges of other dimensions, and constructed in any other manner than is hereinbefore required, and that in all cases where the acts or omissions of the said Railway Company respecting the said several bridges and works hereinbefore required to be made respecting or affecting the said Calder and Hebble Navigation or the Company of Proprietors thereof, would subject the said Railway Company to any action, suit or other proceeding at law or in equity by the said Company of Proprietors of the Calder and Hebble Navigation, the said Railway Company shall not be so liable, in case the consent in writing, under the common seal of the said Navigation Company, shall be obtained to each such particular act or omission.

**Provided** 

Provided always, and be it enacted, That nothing in this Saving the Act contained shall extend to prejudice, diminish, alter or Rights of the Leeds and take away any of the rights, privileges, powers or authorities Bradford vested in the Leeds and Bradford Railway Company, but Railway Company. saving and reserving to the said Leeds and Bradford Railway Company all the rights, privileges and franchises of the said Company, and also saving and reserving all powers, authorities and provisions in the several Acts relating thereto, as if this Act had not been passed.

And be it enacted, That all communications between Communicathe Railway hereby authorized to be made and the Leeds and tions with the Leeds and Bradford Railway, and all such openings in the ledges or Bradford flanches of the said Leeds and Bradford Railway, as may be Railway to necessary or convenient for effecting such communications, be made under the shall be made under the direction and superintendence of the direction of engineer for the time being of the said Leeds and Bradford their Engineer. Railway Company, and that no such communication shall be so made as to interfere with the junction line of the said Leeds and Bradford Railway, extending from the main line at or near the division of the townships of Holbeck and Wortley, to a point on the Branch of the Leeds and Bradford Railway, authorized to be made through the property of Hugo Charles Meynell Ingram, Esquire.

And be it enacted, That in case it shall be found neces- Leeds and sary to carry the Railway by this Act authorized across the Bradford Railway not Leeds and Bradford Railway, it shall not be lawful to carry to be crossed the same across such Railway upon the level, but the same on the Level. shall be carried across such Railway by means of a bridge, of such dimensions as shall be approved of by the engineer for the time being of the said Leeds and Bradford Railway Company: Provided always, that the dimensions of such bridge shall not exceed the clear width of thirty feet between the abutment walls, and the clear height of fifteen feet from the surface of the rails of the said Leeds and Bradford Railway, to the soffit of the arch of such bridge, and such clear height to extend across the whole width of the said last mentioned Railway.

And be it enacted, That in case during the construction Damages to of the works for carrying the Railway by this Act authorized Bradford Bradford across the said Leeds and Bradford Railway, or at any time Railway to after such works shall have been completed, any damage or be made

injury good.

injury shall be thereby occasioned to the said Leeds and Bradford Railway, or the traffic thereupon shall be in any way thereby interrupted, the Company hereby incorporated shall and they are hereby required to make good such damage or injury, and to reimburse the said Leeds and Bradford Railway Company all costs and expenses which they shall have incurred in consequence thereof.

34. Certain Property not to be affected.

And be it enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend, or be held to extend, to confer any powers on the Company hereby incorporated, in respect of the roads and properties numbered on the said plan respectively 57, 58, 59, 60 and 79, nor to empower such Company to interfere with or divert the road called Aire Street and the road in front of the Wellington Hotel shown on the said plan.

35. Tolls.

Tonnage on Articles of Merchandize. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Company to demand any tolls for the use of the Railway not exceeding the following; that is to say: In respect of the tonnage of all articles conveyed upon the Railway or any part thereof, as follows:

For all dung, compost, and all sorts of manure, lime and limestone, and all undressed materials for the repair of public roads or highways, per ton per mile not exceeding one penny; and if conveyed by carriages belonging to the Company, an additional sum per ton per mile not exceeding one halfpenny;

For all coals, coke, culm, charcoal and cinders; all stones for building, pitching and paving; all bricks, tiles, slates, clay, sand, ironstone and iron ore, pig iron, bar iron, rod iron, hoop iron, and all other similar descriptions of wrought iron, and iron castings, not manufactured into utensils or other articles of merchandize, per ton per mile not exceeding one penny halfpenny; and if conveyed in carriages belonging to the Company, an additional sum per ton per mile not exceeding one halfpenny;

For all sugar, grain, corn, flour, hides, dyewoods, earthenware, timber, stones and deals, metals (except iron), nails, anvils, vices and chains, per ton per mile two pence; and if conveyed in carriages belonging to the Company, an additional sum per ton per mile not

exceeding three farthings;

For all cotton and other wools, drugs, manufactured goods,

goods, and all other wares, merchandize, fish, articles, matters or things, per ton per mile not exceeding three pence; and if conveyed in carriages belonging to the Company, an additional sum per ton per mile not exceeding one penny;

And for every carriage, of whatever description, not being a carriage adapted and used for travelling on a Railway, and not weighing more than one ton, carried or conveyed on a truck or platform not belonging to

the Company, per mile not exceeding six pence;

And a sum of two pence per mile for every additional quarter of a ton, or fractional part of a quarter of a ton, which any such carriage may weigh; and if any such carriage be conveyed on a truck or platform belonging to the Company, an additional sum per mile not exceeding two pence;

In respect of passengers and animals conveyed in carriages Tolls for

upon the Railway, as follows:

Passengers or Cattle.

For any person conveyed in or upon any such carriage, per mile not exceeding two pence; and if conveyed in or upon any carriage belonging to the Company, an additional sum not exceeding one penny;

For every horse, mule, ass, or other beast of draught or burden, and for every ox, cow, bull, or neat cattle, conveyed in or upon any such carriage, per mile not exceeding three pence; and if conveyed in or upon any carriage belonging to the Company, an additional

sum not exceeding one penny;

For every calf or pig, sheep, lamb, or other small animal conveyed in or upon any such carriage, per mile not exceeding one penny; and if conveyed in or upon any carriage belonging to the Company, an additional sum not exceeding one farthing.

And be it enacted, That the toll which the Company Tolls for may demand for the use of engines for propelling carriages propelling on the Railway shall not exceed one penny per mile for each passenger or animal, or for each ton of goods or other articles, in addition to the several other tolls or sums by this Act authorized to be taken; except where the said Company may be required to carry such passengers, animals or goods at a greater rate of speed than the ordinary rate of conveying the same on the Railway by the said trains respectively, or with a less load than may be the full load for any such engine

so to be employed: Provided always, that nothing hereinbefore contained shall extend to any case in which any special or extra train may be required and may be allowed by the Company.

Regulations as to the Tolls.

And be it enacted, That the following provisions and regulations shall be applicable to the fixing of such tolls; (that is to say,)

Short Distances.

For articles or persons conveyed on the Railway for a less distance than four miles, the Company may demand the tolls and charges hereinbefore prescribed as for four miles.

Fractional Parts of a Mile.

For a fraction of a mile beyond four miles, or beyond any greater number of miles, the Company may demand tolls on merchandize for such fraction, in proportion to the number of quarters of a mile contained therein; and if there be a fraction of a quarter of a mile, such fraction shall be deemed a quarter of a mile, and in respect of passengers, every fraction of a mile beyond the integral number of miles shall be deemed a mile;

Fractional Parts of a Ton.

For a fraction of a ton, the Company may demand toll according to the number of quarters of a ton in such fraction, and if there be a fraction of a quarter of a ton, such fraction shall be deemed a quarter of a ton;

General Weight.

With respect to all articles, except stone and timber, the weight shall be determined according to the usual avoirdupois weight;

Weight of Stone and Timber.

With respect to stone and timber, fourteen cubic feet of stone, forty cubic feet of oak, mahogany, teek, beech, or ash, and fifty cubic feet of any other timber, shall be deemed one ton weight, and so in proportion for any smaller quantity.

38. Tolls for and great Weights.

And with respect to small packages and single articles small Parcels of great weight, be it enacted, that notwithstanding the rate of tolls prescribed by this Act, the Company may lawfully demand the tolls following; (that is to say,)-

For the carriage of small parcels (that is to say, parcels not exceeding five hundred pounds weight each), the Company may demand any sum which they think fit: Provided always, that articles sent in large aggregate quantities, although made up of separate parcels, such as bags of sugar, coffee, meal, and the like, shall

not be deemed small parcels, but such term shall apply only to single parcels in separate packages;

For the carriage of any one boiler, cylinder, or single piece of machinery, or single piece of timber or stone, or other single article, the weight of which, including the carriage, shall exceed four tons, but shall not exceed six tons, the Company may demand such sum as they think fit, not exceeding six pence per ton per mile; For the carriage of any single piece of timber, stone, machinery, or other single article, the weight of which with the carriage shall exceed six tons, the Company

may demand such sum as they think fit.

And be it enacted, That every passenger travelling upon Passengers' the Railway may take with him his ordinary luggage, not Luggage. exceeding the weight and dimensions following; (that is to say,)

Every passenger travelling in a first class carriage not exceeding one hundred pounds in weight, and four cubic feet in dimensions;

Every passenger travelling in a second class carriage not exceeding sixty pounds in weight, and four cubic feet in dimensions; and

Every passenger travelling in a third class carriage not exceeding forty pounds in weight, and four cubic feet in dimensions;

without any charge being made for the carriage thereof.

Provided always, and be it enacted, That the maximum Maximum rate of charge to be made by the Company for the conveyance Rate of Charge for of passengers upon the said Railway, including the tolls for Passengers; the use of the Railway, and of carriages, and for locomotive power, and every other expense incidental to such conveyance, shall not exceed the following sums:

For every passenger conveyed in a first-class carriage, the sum of three pence halfpenny per mile;

For every passenger conveyed in a second-class carriage, the sum of two pence halfpenny per mile;

For every passenger conveyed in a third-class carriage, the sum of one penny halfpenny per mile;

And with respect to the conveyance of horses, cattle, car- for Animals riages and goods, the maximum rate of charge, including the and Goods. tolls for the use of the Railway, and of waggons or trucks, and locomotive power, and every expense incidental to such conveyance,

conveyance, (except the loading and unloading of goods,) shall not exceed the sums following:

For every horse, mule, ass or other beast of draught or burden, and for every ox, cow, bull or neat cattle, the sum of five pence per mile;

For every calf, pig, sheep, lamb or other small animal, the sum of one penny per mile;

For carriages, the sum of sixpence per mile;

For all dung, compost and all sorts of manure, lime and limestone, and all undressed materials for the repair of public roads or highways, the sum of two pence per ton per mile;

For all coals and culm, the sum of two pence per ton per

mile;

For all coke, charcoal and cinders, all stones for building, pitching and paving, all bricks, tiles, slates, clay, sand, iron stone, and iron ore, pig iron, bar iron, rod iron, hoop iron, and all other similar description of wrought iron, and iron castings not manufactured into utensils, or other articles of merchandize, three pence halfpenny per ton per mile;

For all sugar, grain, corn, flour, hides, dyewoods, earthenware, timber, stones and deals, metals (except iron), nails, anvils, vices and chains, the sum of fourpence

per ton per mile;

For all cotton, and other wools, drugs, manufactured goods and all other wares, merchandize, fish, articles, matters or things, the sum of four pence halfpenny per

ton per mile;

as to Cattle. Provided always, That with respect to cattle and sheep, when a waggon for the carriage of cattle or sheep shall be engaged by one party the charge for any such waggon, capable of containing six cattle or thirty sheep, shall not exceed one shilling and three pence per mile.

41. Restrictions as to Tolls for Passengers not applicable to Special Trains.

Provided always, and be it enacted, That the restriction as to the charges to be made for passengers shall not extend to any special or extra train that may be required to run upon the said Railway, but shall apply only to the ordinary trains appointed, or to be appointed, by the said Company for the conveyance of passengers and goods upon the said Railway.

And

And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Direc- Interest to tors of the said Company from and after the passing of this be paid on Calls. Act, and from thenceforth until the said Railway shall be completed and opened to the public, to pay interest at any rate not exceeding four pounds per centum per annum on all sums called up in respect of the said shares, from the respective days on which the same shall have been paid, such interest to accrue and be paid at such times and places as the Directors for the time being shall appoint for that purpose: Provided always, that no interest shall accrue to the proprietor of any share upon which any call shall appear to be in arrear in respect of such share, or any other share to be holden by the same proprietor, during the period while such call shall remain unpaid.

And be it enacted, That the remuneration of the Direc-Remunerators shall from time to time be fixed by a general meeting of tion of Directors. the Company.

And whereas a Bill is now pending before Parliament, Only one intituled "An Act for making a Railway from the Sheffield, Line of Railway to be "Ashton-under-Lyne, and Manchester Railway at Staly-made from "Bridge, to the Manchester and Leeds Railway at Kirk-between cer-"heaton, with a Branch therefrom, and for consolidating tain points. " into one Undertaking the said proposed Railway and the "Huddersfield Canal Navigation;" and the line of the Railway and one of the Branches thereof hereby respectively authorized to be made, and the line of the intended Railway of the Company proposed to be incorporated by the last recited Bill, under the name of the Huddersfield and Manchester Railway and Canal Company, follow the same course between the town of Huddersfield and the Manchester and Leeds Railway, being a distance of about four miles, and it is expedient that provision should be made, and that an arrangement should be effected under the authority of Parliament between the two Companies with respect to the construction of the said portion of Railway and the said Branch, and it has accordingly been agreed between the said two Companies that the Company hereby incorporated shall suspend the making of so much of their proposed Railway and Branch as lies between Huddersfield aforesaid and the said Manchester and Leeds Railway, and that the said last-mentioned portion of the said Railway and the said Branch shall be made by the said Huddersfield and Manchester 13

Manchester Railway and Canal Company; be it therefore enacted, That none of the powers and authorities by this Act given to and vested in the Company hereby incorporated shall be or shall be capable of being put into force or executed by the said Company hereby incorporated, in respect of the making of that portion of the said Railway and the said Branch which lies between Huddersfield aforesaid and the said Manchester and Leeds Railway, for the space of eighteen months after the passing of this Act; and if the said Huddersfield and Manchester Railway and Canal Company shall, before the expiration of the said eighteen months, have commenced and proceeded bonâ fide in the execution of that part of the said Railway and Branch, then and in such case all and every the powers and authorities vested in the said Company hereby incorporated, so far as respects the making of that portion of the said Railway and Branch, and also all liabilities of the said last mentioned Company in respect of such portion and Branch, shall absolutely cease and be at an end.

Act relating to such Act, or of any General Act relating to Railways which may hereafter pass during the present or any future Session of Parliament, or from any future revision and alteration under the authority of Parliament of the maximum rates of fares and charges authorized by this Act.
